CONDITIONS

- Maximum size of framed articles for display must be 1300mm high x 1000mm. Tablecloths and Quilts no restrictions.
- Items having won a First Prize at a MBA&H Society Inc. Show are ineligible.
- Only 1 (one) piece per entry unless stated otherwise then joined together.
- Entries to be handed in by 10am Friday 20th September 2024, convenors will be at the pavilion on Thursday 26th September from 1pm to 4pm to accept entries.
- Late entries will not be accepted or staged
- Please put entry tickets on the back of the article secured with a small pin.
- All exhibitors enter at their own risk. All care will be taken in the transit, storing, handling and displaying of the entries. Unfortunately accidents may and do sometimes occur resulting in damage or loss.
- The Murray Bridge A & H Society Inc. staff, convenors, stewards, committee, judges and volunteers will not be held responsible or liable for any loss or damage to any entry which may occur.
- The section judges, convenors, committees or Murray Bridge A&H Society Inc. officials have the right to add, delete, combine or alter any of the advertised classes if they feel it is for the betterment of the section.
- Judges will take finish and presentation into account.
- The judges' decisions are final. NO correspondence or protest will be entered into regarding the results.
- The advertising of any items for sale or the displaying of business cards or other advertising material within the Ken Wells OAM Pavilion is strictly prohibited by law.
- The sale of goods at the show is available to those who purchase a trade site.
- Following the close of the show on Saturday 28th September 2024 ALL entries and any prizes won must be collected from the Ken Wells OAM Pavilion via the section convenor between 4pm and 5pm.
- Exhibit Cards and a copy of the entry form will be required for the collection of entries and any prizes won.
- Any uncollected entries and prizes will be held in trust by the society and must be collected from the show office by appointment no later than 4th October 2024.
- All uncollected entries will be disposed of, and any prizes will be recycled after this date.
